 5. Carrots, 3 of any cultivar
 6. Pair of cucumbers
 7. Pair of courgettes
 8. Pair of marrows
 9. A pair of any vegetable not previously mentioned.
 10. Plate of 3 cooking apples
 11. Plate of 3 dessert apples

 18. Onions, 3, grown from sets
 19. Onions, 3, grown from seeds
 20. Red onions, 3, grown from sets.

FLOWERS

21. Specimen rose
 22. 2 floribunda rose sprays
 23. 1 spike gladiolus
 24. Floating flower heads in a bowl or dish not to exceed 260mm.
 25. Vase of 3 heads of hydrangea
 26. Vase of 3 dahlias
 27. Vase of michaelmas daisies
 28. Vase of 3 spray chrysanthemums
 29. 5 pansies or violas arranged on a card
 30. Basket of herbs, 6 varieties (maximum size of basket 15.2x20.3cms or 6x8")

 32. Vase of mixed flowers
 33. 5 fuchsia heads arranged on a card
 34. A vase of one variety of cut shrub or tree for fruit effect
 35. Vase of one variety of cut shrub or tree for foliage colour.

36. 1 orchid in flower (any cultivar)
 37. 1 geranium plant
 38. 1 fuchsia

39. 1 flowering pot plant
40. 1 cactus or succulent
41. 1 pot plant - foliage

FLORAL ART

42. An arrangement in a tea cup & saucer ,not exceeding 150mm in depth, width & height.
43. An arrangement for the centre of a dining table not exceeding 250mm in depth, width & height.

COOKERY

44. Victoria sponge sandwich (3 eggs,170g SR flour,170g margarine,170g caster sugar, 1 teaspoonful of baking powder, milk to mix (if necessary),raspberry jam filling, caster sugar topping after baking.(170g = 6oz)
45. Chocolate sandwich. 3 egg recipe,sandwiched with chocolate butter icing & with icing sugar on top.
46. 5 flap jacks
47. 5 cheese scones
48. 5 pieces of tray bake
49. 5 rock cakes
50. An apple tart(pastry top and bottom)

JAMS

51. Pot of home - made jam - stoned fruit 51(a) A pot of home-made black or red currant jam.
52. Pot of home-made raspberry jam. 52(a) A pot of home-made preserve with fruit not previously mentioned(can be seedless)
53. Pot of home-made strawberry jam.
54. Pot of home-made marmalade
55. Pot of home-made chutney.

56. A collection of wild flowers in a jam jar

The Ken Norrey Perpetual Trophy will be awarded for the best exhibit out of classes 25, 31 & 32. Sadly, Ken died in June 2005 and the Dymock Horticultural Society (now Dymock Gardeners` Club), of which Ken was a founder member, has kindly donated the trophy. He was

also the Chairman of the Dymock Parish Hall Charity committee for a number of years. He had a beautiful garden and always made a number of entries in the show.

The Ernest England Perpetual Plate kindly presented by his family in his memory, will be awarded for the best vegetable exhibit grown within 2 miles of Dymock.

Points for cups will be awarded as follows:-

1st prize = 4 points, 2nd prize = 2 points, 3rd prize = 1 point.

PRIZES

1st prize = £1, 2nd prize = 60p, 3rd prize = 40p.

ENTRY FEE

30p per class except class 17 which is 50p and classes 56 & 57 which are free.

RULES

1. All classes open to any member of the public
2. All entry forms to be returned to Mrs.J.B.Thick by September 21st.
3. All exhibits to be staged by **10.30am** on day of show (hall open from **8.15am**) and not removed before **4.30pm**.
4. Only **2** exhibits per exhibitor in any one class and only **1** amount of prize money per class.
5. The judge's decision is final in all classes.
